TRAVEL ADVISORY NO.01; MAY 25, 2026 ON THREAT OF EBOLA OUTBREAK

On May 16, 2026, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared the Ebola virus disease (EVD) outbreaks in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and the Republic of Uganda a **Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC)**.

Considering the rapid spread of the disease in the DRC, the Government of the Republic of Liberia, through the Ministry of Health (MoH) and the National Public Health Institute of Liberia (NPHIL) has activated the EVD public health measures at Points of Entry for travelers in addition to ongoing measures in keeping with the International Health Regulations (IHR 2005).


As a result, the Government of the Republic of Liberia herewith issue this **EVD Travel Advisory No. 01; May 25, 2026** with immediate effect as follows:

1. All travelers arriving from or transiting through DRC or Uganda will be required to truthfully fill out a **Traveler's Surveillance Form** provided onboard or upon arrival.
2. At all points of entry (airports, ground crossings, and sea ports), health screening including body temperature will be checked on all travelers. A person suspected of having signs and symptoms of EVD or any other infectious disease will be managed accordingly, in keeping with the National Point of Entry Standard Operating Procedures.
3. All travelers will be provided with health information, advised to self-monitor and report on signs and symptoms of EVD or any other infectious disease to the nearest health facility or call toll free number **4455**.
4. All travelers and conveyance operators should adhere to Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures such as handwashing, use of sanitizers, and avoid unnecessary physical contact.

5. Any contaminated conveyance with suspected person, cargo or human remains of EVD or any other infectious disease will be decontaminated at Point of Entry to control spread of the disease.
6. All Liberian citizens and residents are strongly advised against non-essential travels to Ebola affected countries.

The Government of Liberia assures the public that there is currently no case of Ebola Virus Disease in Liberia. However, heightened surveillance and preparedness measures are being implemented to protect public health.

NB: This Travel Advisory will be revised from time to time as the need arises.
